History of the Church

The First Presbyterian Church of South Amboy was organized in December 1864. Soon after a Sunday School was started. The church building was completed in February 1868 on land donated by the Camden and Amboy Railroad.

In 1874 Prayer Meetings were held weekly and semi-weekly with good attendance.

In 1918, during the Influenza epidemic, the church was turned over to the Gray Nurses to be used as an emergency hospital.

In 2012, while people were recovering from Superstorm Sandy, the church temporarily opened a 24 hour soup kitchen.

It has always been the primary aim of our church to present the Gospel and Spread the goodness of Christ.

The Lord continues to guide us as we present the Gospel and spread the good news of Jesus Christ to others through our words and deeds.

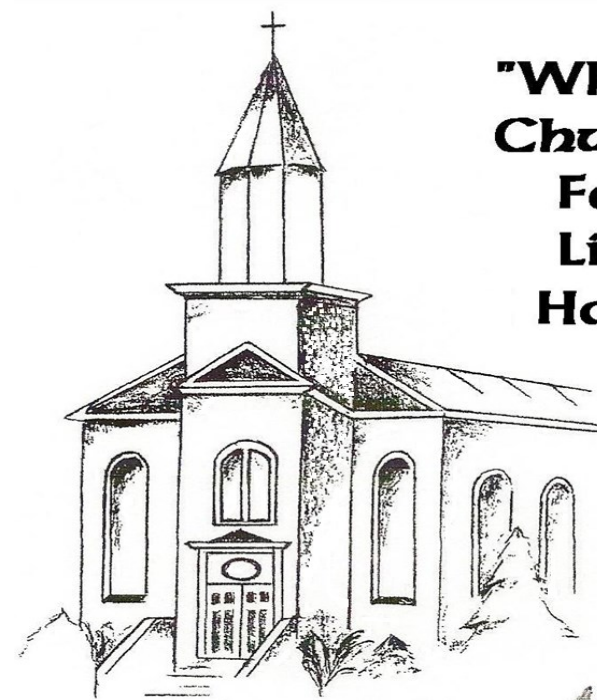
